We are pleased to present in this issue a profile of GSG member Richard Hill.

Michigander **Richard Hill**'s search to find his biological parents prompted him to research his family history, which eventually led to lecturing on genetic genealogy and the uses of DNA testing. Interviewed by renowned genetic genealogist CeCe Moore about his pioneering use of DNA testing to find his birth father's family, he was influenced to share his knowledge with others. He, in turn, helped influence CeCe to share her talents to help thousands of adoptees.

Richard began speaking in 2009 to share his DNA success story. In 2012, he self-published his journey in *Finding Family: My Search for Roots and the Secrets in My DNA*. The book was republished in 2017 by a publishing company and is now also available as an audiobook on Audible. With encouragement from Ms. Moore, he created more presentations and offers half- and full-day seminars.

Speaking nationally, Richard's audiences are mostly genealogists, but his presentation on ethnic ancestry occasionally attracts a much broader audience. He recently presented online to the staff of a U.S. Customs and Border Protection unit for Family History Month. He has found that, although most attendees have taken DNA tests, he always

covers enough of the basics, so those who have not yet tested can follow along and proceed step-bystep to an intermediate level. He leaves the most advanced topics to specialists.

The Covid pandemic taught all of us the benefits of Zoom and other



similar platforms which enable speakers to reach every corner of the globe. By eliminating the need to travel, and the expenses that entails, even small societies can provide top-notch speakers for their members. Even remotely, Richard enjoys the Q&A sessions following his lectures and the interaction with his audiences.

A long-time GSG member, Richard shares his home with his wife of 56 years, and two cats.



He also belongs to the American Adoption Congress.

His advice: Don't depend on one talk. Build a portfolio of related but uniquely different presentations.

HIRING A SPEAKER

Our professional genealogical speakers are eager to help you deliver a quality event. Visit our directory of speakers at <u>Directory of Members – Genealogical Speakers Guild</u>. Here are some helpful guidelines for working with our professional genealogical speakers.

Organization/Society

- Contacts the speaker well in advance of the event and advertises only after a written agreement is reached.
- Provides written confirmation of the engagement including topics, arrangements, and compensation.
- Sends a draft of promotional materials including proposed presentation schedule.
- Organizes the event including location, publicity, and logistics.
- Furnishes the required audio-visual equipment.
- Appoints a host to assist the speaker with local arrangements.
- Compensates speaker at close of the event, according to agreed terms which may include honorarium, travel, and other expenses.

Speaker

- Provides written confirmation of the engagement including the topics to be presented.
- Informs organization/society in advance about requirements including audio-visual needs and any special dietary or lodging needs.
- Informs organization/society in advance about whether recordings (audio or video) are allowed.
- Sends handout material, if any, in advance to allow organization/society to duplicate it, and includes written permission for the society to print.
- Gives well-organized, educational lectures on the agreed-upon topics.
- Provides information and materials in a timely fashion.

Organization/Society and Speaker

• Each should maintain communication with the other about arrangements for the event.

CLAIRE V. BRISSON-BANKS, BS, MLIS, AG

Claire V. Brisson-Banks, a twenty-year member of GSG, was inspired to research her genealogy by her husband, who had begun his search before their marriage. She reached out to her mother and aunt to help fill in the missing pieces on her side of the family. As a mom with six children, she didn't venture too far from the home until her youngest was in school. She then went back to work and to college where she attained her BS, MLIS.

Now living in Missouri with her husband, Les, and two of her adult children, Claire is a native of Rhode Island. She was named Director of Rhode Island's first Family History Center, in 1988, and ran five conferences there. She and her family later moved to Utah, where she worked at the Family History Library and taught multiple courses, in addition to providing programs at Roots'Tech and during Education Week at BYU. Claire worked as a professor for BYUI from 2015 through 2019 when she began her studies to earn her doctorate.

In addition to lecturing extensively throughout the United States, Claire has spoken in Australia, and provided programs in England's "Who Do You Think You Are," in 2011. She is no stranger to providing lectures via webinars on her specialties of England, Scotland, Ireland, Australia, the US and Canada, and Youth. She is grateful for the ability to keep in



touch, not only with the genealogical community, but with her far-flung children, 23 grandchildren, and eight greatgrandchildren via Zoom and social media.

Claire finds sharing the knowledge she's gained with the people she meets a privilege and honor, and she is pleased that some of those people become clients. Most of her speaking engagements are found through her website, the Midwest Genealogical Center, and of course GSG. She also belongs to the American-French Genealogical Society, the International Commission for the Accreditation of Professional Genealogists, International Society for British Genealogy and Family History, and the Missouri State Genealogical Association, plus a few others.



Do you have a tip to share? Actually, I have a "lesson learned." I was asked to teach at a hotel for a group visiting the area. Their connector to my computer didn't work and I ended up showing the slides on my small computer. While most there didn't complain as it was a technical issue, a couple did and from that point on, I've always had my own set up should there be a need. She also cautions speakers to know their slides, be prepared, and say a little prayer. With those preparations, you can't go wrong.

Closing thoughts? To those who think they can't do this, I'm here to say, "You can!" No matter what obstacles you have in your way now, don't ever give up, keep trying, and eventually you will succeed!

In June 2021, we announced that a new feature had been added to the GSG website—the ability to upload a PDF file to your profile. Speak! Policies

Speak!, the quarterly newsletter of the Genealogical Speakers Guild, is published in March, June, September, and December. The deadline for submission of articles and other material for the newsletter is the 15th of the prior month (15 February, 15 May, 15 August, and 15 November).

As stated in Article II of the Bylaws of the Genealogical Speakers Guild (as amended and restated May 2004), the objectives of GSG shall be

- 1. To provide a unified, effective voice to promote speakers' interests by providing a forum for the discussion of topics of concern to genealogical speakers;
- 2. To broaden the speaker base by identifying, educating, and assisting promising speakers;
- 3. To raise professional lecture standards; and
- 4. To aid speakers in understanding and fulfilling their obligations to program planners and to audiences.

Guidelines for Submitting Feature Articles Prior to submitting a feature article, authors are requested to review the newsletter guidelines outlined in this document (*Speak!* Policies) and submit article topic to *Speak!* editor, Lauren Maehrlein (*editor@genealogicalspeakersguild.org*), for approval. Unsolicited articles will be returned to the author along with a copy of *Speak!* Policies.

- Articles must address a topic directly related to genealogical speaking.
- Articles should be no more than 2,000 words.
- Book reviews should be no more than 750 words.
- The editor retains the right of acceptance of all articles, news, and announcements.
- The editor retains the right to edit articles for accuracy, clarity, and length. Articles will be edited to conform to the latest edition of *The Chicago Manual of Style*.
- Authors retain their copyright.
- First-time submissions should be accompanied by a short (75 words or fewer) bio of the author and a photo. Both will be printed with the article when published.
- Not all articles submitted may be accepted for publication.
- Articles may not be published in the order in which they are received. The editor will balance content and topics throughout the year.
- Articles by non-members will be considered when space permits.

These guidelines do not apply to member news, calls for papers, or other notices and/or announcements submitted by GSG members. Adopted November 2010; updated January 2015.
